Dear Sir/Maam,

Please refer to this Ministry's letter No.V.11025/10/2019-MEP dated 29.01.2019 regarding reservation for Exonomically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Central Educational Institutions (copy enclosed).

I would like to inform that to implement reservation for Economically Weaker Sections in admission to educational institutions from academic year 2019-20 onwards for students/candicates who are not covered the existing schemes of reservation of SC/ST/OBC and as per the mandate of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, 10% seats for EWSs are to be created in medical colleges. The Medical Council of India has already requested you to send a proposal in this regard for increasing 10% seats for the reservation of Economically Weaker Sections.

As you are aware that this Ministry is implementing Centrally Sponsored Schemes namely "Strengthening and Upgradation of existing State Government/Central Government Medical Colleges to increase PG seats in the country – Phase II" and "Upgradation of existing State Government/Central Government Medical College to increase MBBS seats in the country". The schemes have been approved with fund sharing between the Central Government and the State Governments in the ratio of 90:10 for North Eastern and Special Category States and 60:40 for other States with the upper ceiling of cost pegged at Rs.1.20 crore per seat.

In view of the above, you are requested to send proposals under Centrally Sponsored Scheme for increasing UG/PG seats including 10% seats for the reservations to the Economically Weaker Sections with gap analysis and the details of required infrastructure and equipment with estimated cost for increase of UG/PG seats in existing and eligible Government Medical Colleges in your State/UT immediately.

SUB: Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Central Educational Institutions – Regarding.

Sir,

I am directed to enclose herewith a copy of 0.M. dated 17.01.2019 of the Ministry of Human Resource Development for implementation of reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) in admission to educational institutions from academic year 2019-20 onwards for students/candidates who are not covered under the existing schemes of reservation of SC/ST/OBC and as per the mandate of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 to say:

- a) The 8 Institutions of excellence, research institutions and institutions of national and strategic importance as specified in the Schedule to The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006 and minority educational institutions referred to in Article 30(1) of the Constitution are exempted from the operation of this Amendment Act, 2019. It is informed that North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health and Medical Science, Shillong (NEIGRIHMS) is one of the 8 Institutions exempted by the Act, 2006,
- b) Every Central Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority as defined in clause (c) of section 2 of the Act, 2006, increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty so that the number of seats available, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the EWSs, is not less than the number of such seats available, in each category for the academic session immediately preceding the cate of coming into force of these guidelines.
- c) The applicability of this Amendment Act, 2019 for the increase of annual permitted strength need to be implemented from the academic year following the commencement of the Amendment Act but in case the annual permitted strength cannot be implemented for reasons of financial, physical or academic limitation or in order to maintain the standards of education, such increase can be implemented over a period of two years beginning with the academic

session 2019-20, after the representation by the Central Education Institution to the appropriate authority and subject to its satisfaction on the grounds as stated above. At any stage of implementation of EWS reservation, the number and percentage of reservation provided for SC/ST/OBC categories shall not be

- d) It is mentioned that no reservation is applicable in Super Specialty courses.
- e) All State Governments/UTs have also been requested to give effect to the provisions of the said Constitution Amendment Act in respect of all higher education institutions funded/aided, directly or indirectly by the State Government starting from the academic year 2019-20.
- The Board of Governors in supersession of Medical Council of India, National Board of Examination, Dental Council of India, Indian Nursing Council and Pharmacy Council of India have been asked to take all necessary measures including enabling amendments in the Regulations to facilitate implementation of the provisions of the Constitution (Amendment) Act, 2019 with immediate effect.
- All States/UTs are requested to take appropriate action for implementing the 3. provisions of the Amendment Act in the Medical/Dental/Nursing/Pharmacy Institutions/Bodies etc under their control.

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to refer to the Provisions of the Constitution Amendment (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 dated 12.01.2019 for implementation of reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) in admission to educational Institutions for the academic year 2019-20 and BoG-MCI's letter No.MCI-34(41)(EWS)/2019-Med./122349 dated 04/06 June, 2019 seeking applications from the Medical Colleges/Institutions for increase of MBBS seats to implement EWS quota and to say that BoG-MCI after considering the applications, vide letter No.MCI-34(41)(EWS)/2019-Med./125319-20 dated 20.06.2019 submitted a proposal to the Ministry containing the names of Medical Colleges with permitted MBBS seats under EWS quota for 2019-20.

2. After carefully considering the matter, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has accepted the proposal of the BoG-MCI and hereby directs the Counselling Authorities (States/UTs/AIQ) for filling up the MBBS seats under EWS quota as per rules in forthcoming academic year 2019-20. A copy of the list showing details of Medical Colleges and permitted MBBS seats is enclosed herewith.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN GOVERNMENT OF INDIA (MINISTRY OF HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE) AND THE STATE/UT OF

WHERE AS the Government of India in the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has formulated a Centrally Sponsored Scheme namely "UPGRADATION OF EXISTING GOVERNMENT/CENTRAL GOVERNMENT MEDICAL COLLEGES TO INCREASE MBBS SEATS IN THE COUNTRY" with a view to providing financial assistance to the State Government/UT for increasing MBBS seats in the given below Government Medical Colleges;

AND WHEREAS the State Government/UT is undertaking to increase MBBS seats in Government Medical Colleges as per the guidelines and instructions issued by the MoHFW from time to time. The understanding reached between the MoHFW and the said State Government/UT is stated hereunder:-

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The scheme for increasing MBBS seats is only for the approved Government Medical Colleges in the State/UT and the State/UT Government will provide funds for land requirement, faculty, staff component and recurring expenses etc. which have not been included in the project cost.
- 2. The State Government/UT should draw up a detailed action plan for implementing of the scheme for increasing MBBS seats in the Government Medical Colleges including modalities for examining the proprietary of expenditure (such as estimated value/tendered price of past etc.). A Committee shall be constituted for undertaking the civil work/procurement of equipment/ appointment of requisite of work; purchase of equipment and appointment of requisite faculty and other supporting staff.
- 3. The State Government/UT shall follow Rule 130 to 141 of General Financila Rules (GFR) 2017 for works and Rule 142 to 223 for procurement of Goods under the project. The State Government/UT shall also follow CPWD/State PWD manual for Civil Works.
- 4. Proper record should be kept by the State Government/UT regarding the consolidated details of equipment/c vil work for which bids have been issued, number of responsive bids/unresponsive bids, analysis of reasons for rejection/unresponsive bids. The Bid Evaluation Report, minutes of Committee,

sanction orders etc. should also be kept secure by the State Government/UT. These records will be presented to MoHFW, if required, for audit purpose.

- In respect of award of contract, the Authority competent to accord administrative approval and sanction shall follow the norms/extant guidelines. In so far as procurements/civil work that are within the competency of the authority, the necessary approval may be accorded following the norms/ procurement guidelines of the State Government/UT concerned.
- The State Government/UT shall send request for release of funds item-wise to the MoHFW well in advance, depending on financial plan worked out by them.
- 7. Advances/subsequent release will be made by MoHFW on the satisfaction that the State Government/UT has furnished the necessary utilization certificate, utilization certificate should be w.r.t. funds released to various items of work/components associated to the college.
- 8. The State Government/UT should follow the Minimum Standard Requirements prescribed under the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 1997 and other regulations of The Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 for increasing MBBS seats in the Government Medical College.
- 9. The State Government/UT should submit the applications for seeking necessary permission for increasing of MBBS seats in the Government Medical College U/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 during the earliest available period for making application with in a period of twelve months after approval of the proposal by MoHFW.
- 10. State Government/UT will make available to MoHFW, the utilization certificate duly countersigned by the Administrative Secretary of the Division regulating the Scheme/Finance Secretary for the funds utilized for increasing MBBS seats in the Government Medical Colleges before 15th March, and 15th September every year.
- 11. An Empowered Committee (EC) constituted under the Chairmanship of Secretary (H&FW) by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare will go into rationale for funding in detail and decide the actual amount of funding under the scheme.
- 12. MoHFW would bear 60% of the total amount sanctioned. The remaining 40% would be borne by the State Government/UT. The expenditure over and above the approved cost and all the recurring expenditure after close of the scheme will be borne by Medical College Institution/State Government/UT.
- 13. State Government/UT will intimate to MoHFW, the physical progress of the works being done for increasing MBBS seats under the Scheme in the Government Medical Colleges on regular basis.
- 14. MoHFW/Directorate General of Health Services will have the authority to visit the medical colleges and inspect/verify the progress of works being done as per approved Action Plan and issue directions accordingly.
- 15. In case the State Government/UT does not succeed in fulfilling its commitments to increase MBBS seats, the Empowered Committee shall give an opportunity to the said State Government/UT on the issue to explain the reasons for non-fulfillment

of the commitments. On the basis of the explanations given by the State Government/UT, the Empowered Committee will decide if the funds granted are to be refunded. The decision of Empowered Committee shall be final and binding on the State Government/UT. The State Government/UT will agree to return the funds given to them for this purpose along with interest thereon within a period of 3 months from the date of final decision of the Empowered Committee.

- 16. MoHFW and State Government/UT agree with each other to ensure that the provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding are fully and expeditiously implemented so as to achieve the objective of the Memorandum of Understanding.
- 17. Any notice or communication to be made by the Parties shall be in writing and will be delivered by registered post, fax or e-mail with return receipt. The persons for communication hereafter in respect of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be:

- 18. In the event of any provisions contained in this Memorandum of Understanding rendered unenforceable under the applicable laws, the rest of the provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
- 19. The governing law of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be laws of India.
- Any disputes arising out of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be, at first instance, resolved amicably by the MoHFW, State Government. In case, they are unable to settle the dispute within 30(thirty) days of making reference, the same shall be referred to Empowered Committee for a decision. State Government would be given an opportunity to present their views before the Empowered Committee. Decision of Empowered Committee shall be binding and final on both MoHFW and the State Government.
